Fr. Thomas Dubay

Session 1

1. On p. 10 Fr. Dubay sets out his thesis for this volume:

"The thesis is that the teachings of Teresa and John are nothing more or less than the integral gospel."

Why would this statement be a surprise to many who have been discouraged from delving into these spiritual works? Do you have some of the same fears or pre-conceptions of the writings of these great saints? Is there anything you have experienced in these works that could help to encourage one of your directees to overcome their hesitation and make use of the teachings of John and Teresa to grow in their prayer?

- 2. As we read the author's introduction to each saint in Chapt. 2, what characteristic strikes you the most in the personality and character of St. Teresa? And of St. John?
- 3. Give a few examples of ways in which one can have an "experience of God" and how this may change the person. Is it only in an advanced experience of God that true sanctity occurs in a person?
- 4. How can a too rigid application of a method of meditation obstruct our growth toward union with God?
- 5. When considering the divine gift of contemplation, how does the description of Faith as 'a knowing loving' help us to' prepare ourselves for the gift'?
- 6. Share your thoughts about St. Teresa's 2 main images in describing growth in prayer, water and the crystal interior castle. Do you prefer one over the other in your own reflections?
